### **Mats Granryd, Director General, GSMA**

He is the Director General of the GSMA. He led the mobile industry in becoming the first sector to commit to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in 2016, and is currently leading the climate Initiative to develop a decarbonisation pathway for the mobile sector. He serves on the Broadband Commission for Sustainable Development chairing the Working Group on Digital Gender Divide. Additionally, Mats served on the Business & Sustainable Development Commission until 2018, where he worked with CEOs across many industries in order to achieve a sustainable, inclusive economy.

Before joining the GSMA, Mats was President and CEO of Tele2 and also spent 15 years in a variety of roles at Ericsson.



### **Neil Masterson, CEO, OneWeb**

He spent over 20 years at Thomson Reuters in a number of roles, ultimately ending as co-COO of the global news, information and software group.

He has also served in a number of independent senior advisory roles, including on the board of the financial information company Refinitiv and on the board of advisors for the global technology company IBM. Before joining Thomson Reuters, he spent 10 years at KPMG. He has a BA in Geography from University College London and is a Chartered Accountant.

She is the Director of Women's Economic Empowerment at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Prior to joining the foundation, she worked for 15 years at the World Bank Group, where she served for six years as the CEO of CGAP, a think tank focused on financial services for the poor housed in the World Bank. Prior to that, she was a manager for Financial Institutions Advisory Services at the International Finance Corporation in Latin America and sub-Saharan Africa. ## Margarita Delgado, Deputy Governor, Bank of Spain

She is the Deputy Governor of the Banco de España. She is also a member of the Supervisory Board of the Single Supervisory Mechanism of the European Central Bank, chairwoman of the Management Committee of the Deposit Guarantee Fund for Credit Institutions, vice-chairwoman of the Governing Committee of the FROB (Fund for Orderly Bank Restructuring) and a Director of the National Securities Market Commission (CNMV).

Previously, she was Deputy Director General for Microprudential Supervision I at the European Central Bank. Previously, she was Director within the Directorate General of Supervision at the Bank of Spain. She has also been an Associate Professor at the Complutense University of Madrid, where she obtained her degree in Economics and Business Administration.

## Carlos Torres Vila, Chairman, BBVA

He has been BBVA's Chairman and CEO since December 2018.
